#### Organisation

The Euro-ISME 2012 Conference at the Defence Academy of the United Kingdom is co-organised by the "International Society of Military Ethics in Europe" (a newly registered association under French law) and the Joint Services Command and Staff College at Shrivenham. It is the 2nd Annual Meeting after the inaugural conference held in Paris last year and thus establishes a regular exchange on Military Ethics in close cooperation with European educational institutions It also provides the opportunity for the first "General Assembly" of the Euro-ISME members with a special focus on the election of the managing board and the definition of the action plan for 2013.



Some additional information that might help you with your travel plans:

The Euro-ISME 2012 Conference is at the Joint Services Command and Staff College - Defence Academy, Shrivenham - Post Code SN6 8TS.

Nearest Town is Swindon, approx 9 miles. Oxford is about 20 miles away. Oxford and Swindon are served by Rail and Buses from London.

Most people arrive at Heathrow or Gatwick and travel to Swindon. There is a train from London Heathrow to London Paddington Station every 18 minutes.(http://www.heathrowairport.com/transport-and-directions/trains/heathrow-express)

Trains from Paddington to Swindon take about 1 hour. They run every hour hour and more frequently at peak times. You can get a Taxi from Swindon to the Defence Academy (takes 20 minutes). Although Bristol Airport might look convenient it is not the best option! Getting to and from the Airport from here is quite complicated by road (to avoid city traffic).
